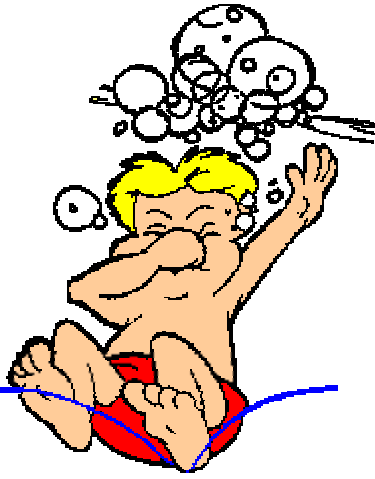
Unregistered Automobiles

There have been some questions raised lately about unregistered cars parked on the streets and in the yards of our community.

Basically, it is unlawful to store nonfunctional motor vehicles for more than 30 days or unregistered functional vehicles for more than 90 days on private property. Nonfunctional vehicles are considered solid waste and must be removed by the owner. Unregistered vehicles are functional vehicles that do not have a current registration. To report such a vehicle on private property call: 240-777-3785 and on public property or roads call: 301-840-2454 .
