### **HCA'S KEY CHALLENGE UPDATE**

During November and December 2004, the Hillandale Citizens Association and Key's Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) teamed to raise money to support efforts to upgrade Key's Media Center to qualify for the International Baccalaureate Organization's Middle Years Program. Outreach was done by sending an e-mail to over 330 HCA members on the community's Yahoo Group list.

HCA challenged residents by offering to match community donations --up to \$500. Donations totaled \$910, and with HCA's \$500, Key's MYP will receive a total of \$1,410.
