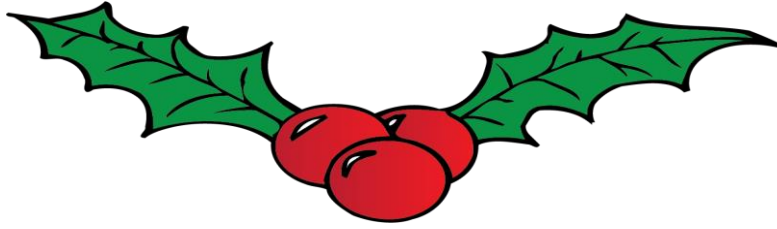

New Speed Caution Signs.

HCA has started an initiative to have dozens of lawn signs printed and placed on our streets to help raise awareness and concerns over speeding and pedestrian safety. After exploring various solutions, the HCA decided that the caution signs were the best solution for Hillandale. The focus will be on heavily traveled streets. The first street to receive these signs is Cresthaven Drive. Once signs are placed on a street, they remain there for a couple of weeks and then will be replaced on another street where traffic volume is high. We work directly with homeowners and only place signs at houses where the homeowner has given us permission. Our plan is to work with residents and place these signs along stretches of our streets and then periodically rotate these signs to raise awareness throughout the community. The signs will serve as a reminder that we live in a residential community and are all responsible for the safety of our residents.

Hillandale Park Pavilion

After a bit of a delay the new picnic pavilion in Hillandale Park is now open for business. The pavilion located near the tot lot at the rear of the park is a replacement for the old park community building that was demolished last year. The pavilion represents another step in the slow but on-going renovation of the park and features picnic tables and a grill. In addition, we would like to remind you that if you have not tried out the new Hillandale Loop Trail that runs through the woods located in the rear of the park, then you are missing out. The trail head is located just behind the tot lot at the edge of the woods. It is a great place for a hike. The trail is well marked and with the fall colors at their peak, well worth a visit. The terrain is hilly but otherwise a suitable walk for all ages.
